Membership Requirements

All competitors must have a current 2026 membership to the Alberta Equestrian Federation, Saskatchewan Horse Federation, BC Horse Council, or other provincial governing body.

Rules

1. The Dunmore Equestrian All Breed Horse Show Committee expects that all competitors and spectators will treat the officials, volunteers, spectators, staff and fellow competitors in a respectful manner. We will not tolerate any harassment, verbal abuse, or disrespectful competitors from the ring, and/or ask people involved with such conduct to leave the grounds of the Dunmore Equestrian arena without compensation.
2. The show will follow the Wild Rose Competition rule book which can be found at <https://www.albertaequestrian-events.com/competitions>. The Equestrian Canada rule book will be followed in any instances where the Wild Rose Competition rule book needs clarification or classes are not included.
3. The organizing committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules, correct any error, or make any alterations that may be necessary in the prize list.
4. Class order is subject to change and times are set as guidelines only. Classes with three or less entries may be combined or cancelled.
5. Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date, but prior to the start of the show, shall be refunded all fees only upon presentation of a valid veterinary certificate or medical letter. Non-veterinary cancellations or scratches will not be refunded.

6. If the competitor is under 18 years of age, the waiver must be signed by the competitor and their parent or guardian. The waiver must be in the hands of the show secretary before rider packages will be given to the exhibitor.
7. The presentation and signing of your entry form shall be deemed acceptance of these rules and absolves the Dunmore Equestrian All-Breed Horse Show Committee and Dunmore Equestrian Society of responsibility or liability.
8. Helmet policy: All youth under 18, as of January 1st of the current year are required to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet.
9. All exhibitors are required to follow tack and attire rules for their classes, including speed (western tack and attire) and in-hand classes (western or English tack and attire).
10. Dogs are NOT allowed in the indoor arena. Dogs must be on a leash at all times while on the grounds.
11. Any protest or complaint during the show must be made in writing and must be submitted to the show secretary, along with a \$50.00 fee (e-transfer or cash), within one hour of the completion of the class or incident in question. A protest must contain a specific statement of an alleged violation of a rule or a condition of a class. It must provide the full name of the alleged violator. The show committee will review the protest and determine a ruling based on the rules and regulations under which the show is sanctioned. Their decision shall be made within six hours and their decision shall be final.
12. Cross-entry rules are as follows:
 - a) Cross-entry is allowed between all Ranch Horse classes and Western Pleasure and/or Western Trail classes.
 - b) Cross-entry is allowed between Senior and Nifty 50+ classes, provided the rider meets the age requirement for Nifty 50+.
 - c) Pee Wee riders may not cross-enter to any other classes other than those listed in their age group information.
 - d) Riders in the Junior or Senior Walk/Trot divisions may not cross-enter into any class requiring a lope or canter.
 - e) Horse/rider combinations in the Schooling Walk/Trot division may not cross-enter into any class requiring a lope or canter, but riders may cross-enter into classes requiring a lope or canter on a different horse.
 - f) Horse/rider combinations in the Novice division may cross-enter into other classes.
13. Horse age rules are as follows:
 - a) Junior horses are five years old or younger as of January 1, 2025. Junior horses may be shown two-handed in a snaffle bit or in a bosal.
 - b) Horses must be age three or older to be shown under saddle at this show. Horses two years old or younger may be shown in Halter, Showmanship, or the In-Hand division.
14. Freestyle Reining Entries are limited to 10 due to time. The class will follow the NRHA handbook, nrha.com/media/pdf/handbook/2023/freestylereining.pdf. Class requirements will be posted on the show's website page.
15. In classes requiring only individual work, an exhibitor may ride up to three horses, with the exception of Freestyle Reining, where a maximum of two horses may be shown by one rider.
16. Horses liable to kick must be identified with a red ribbon in their tail.
17. An unruly horse may be excused from the ring at the discretion of the judge.
18. Any exhibitor using the wrong number in the ring, or having no number, will be disqualified.
19. If a tack change is needed, the hitching ring must be notified prior to the class to have the gate held. The gate will be held for no more than five minutes.
20. Stallions may be exhibited by a rider of senior age, providing the rider is able to manage the stallion on the grounds and in their classes, or they will be excused.

General Information

Stabling

- Outdoor pens will be available on a first come, first serve basis.
- There will be absolutely no arrivals before 12:00 p.m. on Friday, August 7st. If you cannot make this work, please contact Shirley Tryhorn at (403)548-0653.

Arriving, Unloading, Parking and Camping

- If you are staying on site, you can park to the west of the outdoor arena, close to the stabling area. Day parking can be to the east and south of the building. Please do not park trailers next to the building as that is spectator parking.
- Washrooms and porta potties will be available. All campers need to be self-sufficient as no hook-ups are available.

Directions to Dunmore Equestrian Arena

Arriving from the Trans-Canada Highway, turn North at the only set of lights in Dunmore (by the Co-op gas station), then turn right onto the side road to the arena. The arena is visible from the highway.

Other Information

- The Show Office is located in the indoor arena at the west end.
- Patterns will be posted in the hitching ring. Pattern books are included in your show package. Extras will be available for purchase at the show office for \$5.00.
- Day sheets are included in your exhibitor package. Extras will be available for purchase at the show office for \$5.00.
- A food truck will be available during the show, located next to the indoor arena. Hours will be posted in the show office. Beer gardens will be available as well.
- ***This is Alberta - please be prepared for all weather!***

Ride the Pattern Clinic

New this year is a Ride the Pattern Clinic with Krista Freeman, our General Performance judge for the weekend. This will be held on Friday, August 7, beginning at 3:00 p.m. Riders will be split into groups according to their patterns and have the opportunity to get feedback on their showmanship, equitation, and horsemanship patterns for the weekend. Whether you are new to showing or a seasoned competitor, this is a great opportunity to learn from an industry professional and brush up on your pattern skills! Show attire and turnout not required, but please present yourself and your horse in a professional manner for a clinic setting.

Evening Social Hours

Join us Friday and Saturday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the beer gardens, located on the northwest corner of the outdoor arena, for music, food, and a chance to kick back and relax while you get your visiting in with fellow competitors, family, and friends. Food trucks will be on site until 9:00 p.m. Everyone is welcome, minors included. We hope to see you there!

All Other Classes:	\$5.00

Other Fees

Late Fee:	\$25.00 will be charged per horse, class fees will remain the same. Any entries received after July 26, 2025, will be considered late. Post entries can be made at the show office up to 7:00 p.m. the evening before the class.
Ride the Pattern Clinic:	\$60.00 for senior riders (18 and over as of January 1, 2026) \$40.00 for junior riders (17 and under as of January 1, 2026)
Outdoor Pens:	\$20.00 per night, to be submitted with entries
Office Fee:	\$10.00 per horse charged once (if two riders are using the same horse only one will be charged)
Cypress Horse Shows:	\$5.00 circuit fee will be added to each entry

Entry System and Payment

- Online entries at www.horseshowtime.com are the only accepted method of entry to the show.
- Fees may be paid by e-transfer to dunmorehorseshow@gmail.com or by cash. If paying by e-transfer, please make sure your name is in the message if your account is not in your personal name.
- Show fees must be received by the Dunmore Equestrian Society seven days after entry has been made. A statement of account will be sent to the exhibitor.
- ***All fees must be paid in full prior to being allowed to show.***

Exhibitor Age Categories and Division Information

All ages are as of January 1, 2026. Year of birth as noted on their birth certificate determines competition age.

Junior C: 11 years and under (2014 or later)

Junior B: 12-14 years old (2011-2013)

Junior A: 15-17 years old (2008-2010)

Senior: 18 years and over (2007 or earlier)

Nifty Fifty+: 50 years and over (1975 or earlier)

Pee Wee: 3-8 years of age (2017-2022)

Riders must be able to sit in the saddle with their feet in the stirrups and hold the reins. Riders may be led in the ridden classes and can have assistance in Showmanship. The assistant or person leading the rider must be the parent or adult responsible for the rider, be able to control the horse, be dressed in proper attire with safe footwear, have completed the liability form, and have a provincial membership. Classes offered are Showmanship, Trail, Western Pleasure, and Western Horsemanship, as well as the Children's Costume Class.

***Jr. Walk/Trot:** 17 and under (2008 or later)

This is a walk/trot only division for riders new to the show ring and not yet ready to lope or canter in a group. This division is **not** for riders who have show experience in classes requiring lope or canter. Classes offered are Showmanship, English Pleasure, English Equitation, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, and Trail.

***Sr. Walk/Trot:** 18 years and over (2007 or earlier)

This is a walk/trot only division for riders new to the show ring and not yet ready to lope or canter in a group. This division is **not** for riders who have show experience in classes requiring lope or canter. Classes offered are Showmanship, English Pleasure, English Equitation, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, and Trail.

***Schooling Walk/Trot:** Riders must be 15 years or over (2010 or earlier)

This is a walk/trot only division for riders who have show experience, have previously competed in classes requiring lope or canter, who may be returning after time away, managing injury, rebuilding confidence (or other reasons personal to them), or showing a green horse of any age that is not yet ready to lope or canter in a group setting. Classes offered are English Pleasure, English Equitation, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, and Trail.

***Novice:** 15 years and older (2010 or earlier)

This division includes lope or canter, and is for riders or horses who are new to showing and/or not yet confident to canter/lope in a regular age division class. Classes offered are English Pleasure, English Equitation, Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, and Trail.

In-Hand: Yearling or two-year-old horses

Horses are to be shown in a clean and properly fitting halter. Exhibitors may be in western or English attire. Classes offered are Halter Mares and Geldings 3 Years and Under, Yearling & Two Year Old Showmanship, and In-Hand Trail.

Bit Rules for Divisions Noted With an Asterisk *

- Any age of horse may be ridden in any legal bit for the class they are in, but a rider must use two hands if using a snaffle or bosal, and one hand if using a shank bit.
- All other tack and equipment rules are the same as for regular age division classes.
- If you are cross-entering between Novice and any other classes, regular bit rules according to the horse's age will apply in all classes not listed as Novice.

Please note that some divisions are new, and we want to ensure there is a fair, appropriate division for all horses and riders. We are relying on the honour system for competitors to choose the best divisions for themselves and their horses.

Awards

Class Awards

- Ribbons will be awarded 1st-5th in all classes.
- Prize money will be paid for all performance, halter, and gymkhana classes as follows:
1st - \$15.00, 2nd - \$10.00, 3rd - \$5.00.
- For the Western and English Pleasure Stake Classes, the purse will start with \$100.00, and \$20.00 of each entry fee will be added to the payout. The purse will be split as follows:
English Pleasure Stake: 1st – 50%, 2nd – 30%, 3rd – 20%
Western Pleasure Stake: 1st – 50%, 2nd – 30%, 3rd – 20%
- If entries in a Stake class exceed 15, the purse will be split as follows:
English Pleasure Stake: 1st – 40%, 2nd – 30%, 3rd – 20%, 4th – 10%,
Western Pleasure Stake: 1st – 40%, 2nd – 30%, 3rd – 20%, 4th – 10%,
- Prize money will be e-transferred to recipients after the show. Please make sure you have the correct email to receive e-transfer on your entry form.

High Point Awards

All high point awards are based on a horse/rider combination.
A rider does not have to compete in all classes listed to qualify for the award.
