Membership Requirements

All competitors must have a current 2025 membership to the Alberta Equestrian Federations, Saskatchewan Horse Federation, BC Horse Council, or other provincial governing body.

Show Statement

The Dunmore Equestrian All Breed Horse Show Committee expects that all competitors and people will treat the officials, volunteers, spectators, staff and fellow competitors in a respectful manner. We will not tolerate any harassment, verbal abuse, or disrespectful competitors from the ring, and/or ask people involved with such conduct to leave the grounds of the Dunmore Equestrian arena without compensation.

Coggins Test

The Dunmore Equestrian All Breed Horse Show WILL NOT require a negative Coggins test and will be a SK "C" designated event. We encourage all horse owners to familiarize themselves with biosecurity practices when attending any horse event. We reserve the right to require a negative Coggins test if directed by government agencies.



General Rules

- 1. The show will follow the Wild Rose Competition rule book https://www.albertaequestrian-events.com/competitions
- 2. The organizing committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules, and to correct any error or make any alterations that may be necessary in the prize list.
- 3. Class order is subject to change and times are set as guidelines only. Classes with three or less entries may be combined or cancelled.
- 4. Show Fees must be received by the Dunmore Equestrian Society 7 days after entry has been made. A Statement of Account will be sent to the exhibitor. Fees may be paid by E-transfer at time of entry, by mail or in person by cheque, money order, or cash to cover all entry and stabling fees. If you are sending by mail, consider the amount of time needed. E-Transfers can be sent to dunmorehorseshow@gmail.com. NSF cheques will result in a \$50.00 service charge
- 5. A competitor will not be allowed to compete until all entry fees have been paid in full.
- Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date, but prior to the start of the show, shall be refunded all fees only upon presentation of a valid veterinary certificate or medical letter. Non-veterinary cancellations or scratches will not be refunded.
- 7. If the competitor is under 18 years of age, the waiver must be signed by the competitor and parent or guardian. The waiver must be in the hands of the show secretary before rider packages will be given to the exhibitor.

- 8. The presentation and signing of your entry form shall be deemed acceptance of these rules and absolves the Dunmore Equestrian All-Breed Horse Show Committee and Dunmore Equestrian Society of responsibility or liability.
- 9. Helmet policy: All youth under 18, as of January 1st of the current year are required to wear an ASTM/SEI approved.

General Performance

- 10. In the Halter classes, no exhibitor may present more than one horse to the judge in the same halter class. If an exhibitor has more than one horse they would like to show in the same halter class, a different exhibitor must be named. The horse's number will remain the same. The exhibitor can be named as "Unknown" on the entry form; however, the show office MUST be notified of who the unknown handler will be before the show office closes on Friday July 19, 2024. All exhibitors, including unknown exhibitors named the evening before the class, MUST be in proper show attire, have completed a liability waiver, and hold a current membership with their provincial governing body. That exhibitor will show the horse in the class; there can be no exchanging of horses in the show arena by exhibitors.
- 11. Cross-entry IS allowed this year between Ranch Horse classes and Western Pleasure and/or Western Trail. This is subject to change next year.
- 12. Freestyle Reining Entries are limited to 10 due to time. The class will follow the NRHA handbook, nrha.com/media/pdf/handbook/2023/freestylereining.pdf. Class requirements will be posted on the show's website page.
- 13. Pee Wee Division Open to riders 3-8 years of age. Classes are Showmanship, Trail and Pleasure/Horsemanship. Riders are to be lead and can have assistance in Showmanship. Assistant or person leading the rider must be the parent or Adult responsible for the Rider, be able to control the horse, be dressed in proper attire with safe footwear, complete Riders Waiver and have a Provincial Membership.
- 14. Walk/Trot classes are divided into two categories: Short Stirrup riders 14 years and under; Rookie Riders 15 years and over. These classes are intended for riders or horses who are new to the show ring and not yet ready to lope or canter. Riders entered in Walk/Trot classes may not cross-enter any classes which required a rider to lope or canter, except for Barrels and Pole Bending.
- 15. Riders in the Novice division may cross to other classes.
- 16. Junior horses are five years old or younger as of January 1, 2025. Junior horses may be shown two-handed in a snaffle bit or in a bosal.
- 17. Exhibitors may ride more than one horse in classes requiring only individual work: up to 3 horses in an individually judged class. Except for Freestyle Reining, Ranch Trail and Ranch Riding, where a maximum of 2 horses may be exhibited by one Rider.
- 18. Horses liable to kick must be identified with a red ribbon in their tail.
- 19. An unruly horse may be excused from the ring at the discretion of the judge.
- 20. Any exhibitor using the wrong number in the ring, or having no number, will be disqualified.
- 21. If a tack change is needed, the hitching ring must be notified prior to the class to have the gate held. The gate will be held for no more than 10 minutes.
- 22. Stallions may be exhibited by a rider of senior age, and the rider must be able to manage the stallion on the grounds and in the class, or they will be excused.
- 23. Dogs are NOT allowed in the indoor arena.
- 24. Any protest or complaint must be made in writing and must be submitted to the show secretary, along with a \$50.00 fee (etransfer or cash), within one hour of the completion of the class or incident in question. A protest must contain a specific statement of an alleged violation of a rule or a condition of a class. It must provide the full name of the alleged violator. The appointed protest subcommittee will review the protest and determine a ruling based on the rules and regulations under which the show is sanctioned. Their decision shall be made within six hours and their decision shall be final.

Exhibitor Age Categories

All ages are as of January 1, 2025. Year of birth as noted on birth certificate determines competition age.

Pee Wee: Open to children 3-8 years old. Must be able to sit in the saddle with feet in stirrups and hold reins. May not cross enter in any other class.

Short Stirrup: 14 years and under. Walk and jog/trot only. May not cross-enter in lead line or any riding class that will require a lope/canter.

Rookie Rider: Rider 15 years and over. Walk and jog/trot only. May not cross-enter in any riding class that will require a lope/canter.

Novice Rider: Anyone over 15 years that has never placed First in a class. Walk/Trot/Lope

Junior C: 11 years and under (2014 or later)
Junior B: 12-14 years old (2013-2011)
Junior A: 15-17 years old (2010-2008)
Senior: 18 years and over (2007 or earlier)

Nifty Fifty+: 50 years and over (1975 or earlier). A Senior competitor may cross enter the Nifty Fifty+ classes if they

meet the age requirement.

Class Fees

If not specified below, all other classes are \$5.00 per class.

Stake Classes: \$25.00 per class, entry fee added to the payout.

Pee Wee Classes: \$3.00 (Showmanship, Western Pleasure, Trail, Horsemanship and Children's Costume class). Pee Wee riders may be on the lead line for all ridden classes and have an adult assist them in Showmanship.

Pairs Classes: Each competitor must pay an entry fee. Post entries accepted with no late fee.

Post Entries: Any entries received after July 26, 2025, will be considered late. A late fee of \$25.00 will be charged per horse, class fees will remain the same. Post entries can be made at the show office up to 7pm the evening before the class.

Office Fee: \$10.00 per horse charged once (if two riders are using the same horse only one office fee is charged) **GST will be added to the total of the show fees.**

Awards

Ribbons will be awarded $1^{st}-5^{th}$ in all classes. Prize money will be paid for all performance, halter, and gymkhana classes as follows: 1^{st} - \$15.00, 2^{nd} - \$10.00, 3^{rd} - \$5.00.

Stake Western and English Pleasure Classes Purse will start with \$100.00 Each entry fee of \$25.00 will be added to the payout. The pot will be split as follows:

English Pleasure Stake: 1^{st} – 50%, 2^{nd} – 30%, 3^{rd} – 20% Western Pleasure Stake: 1^{st} – 50%, 2^{nd} – 30%, 3^{rd} – 20%

If entries exceed 15 the pot will be split as follows

English Pleasure Stake: 1st – 40%, 2nd – 30%, 3rd – 20%, 4th – 10%, Western Pleasure Stake: 1st – 40%, 2nd – 30%, 3rd – 20%, 4th – 10%,

High Point Awards

All High Point awards are based on a horse-rider combination. A rider does not have to compete in all the classes to qualify for the award. The awards will be presented to the horse-rider combination that has accumulated the most points in the qualifying classes listed under each age division

Western High Point

Will be awarded to the horse-rider accumulating the most points in Showmanship, Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, and Trail.

English High Point

Will be awarded to the horse-rider accumulating the most points in English Pleasure, Equitation, Road Hack and Show Hack.
